Introducing Lutheran Mideast Development

Dear Augustana members and friends,

Over the past 25 years, many important ministries have been launched in Tanzania and Guatemala because of our global partnerships. The historical timeline on the following pages illustrates the progression of our work together. There is still much to do and our work will continue.

For some time, I have been feeling that God is calling us to expand our global outreach and serve new people with the love of Christ. A few years ago, John Snider, Pastor at St. Stephen's Lutheran Church in West St. Paul, introduced me to an organization called Lutheran Mideast Development (LMD). For over 100 years, this highly regarded and trusted Lutheran organization has worked to tear down walls and build bridges between Muslims and Christians in Kurdistan. Their work is focused on education, empowering women, and healthcare, all which perfectly align with our values and priorities in Tanzania and Guatemala.

The pictures on this page give you a brief introduction to this organization. You can learn more about LMD in worship and Adult Forum on April 30. The Executive Field Director of LMD will tell the compelling story of how this organization is helping people who have been attacked by ISIS and providing hope in a land where hope is in short supply. 1991

Augustana was the first congregation in the St. Paul Area Synod to have a companion congregation in Tanzania when we partnered with Ipogoro and its 8 preaching points.

1999

Pastor Aune taught for a semester at Tumaini University. Augustana youth traveled to Tanzania for the first time.
