



***Where Faith Meets Life* End-of-Unit Project—Ten Commandments**

For all confirmation students

We have made some adjustments to the end of the year confirmation projects. In place of each student turning in two projects at the end of the year, students will now complete one project at the end of each unit. Think about this as one project a semester.

These projects are meant to 1) measure where students are with what they are learning, and 2) provide an opportunity to grow in faith as they prepare to affirm their baptism at the Service of Confirmation. We hope this process helps students think about what their faith means to them and how their faith shapes and guides who they are and how they show up in the world each day. The first end-of-unit project students will turn in this year will be on the Ten Commandments.

Project Subject: How the Ten Commandments shape and guide you each day. You may find it helpful to use your weekly *Where Faith Meets Life* Practices to create your end-of-unit project. As an example, you may choose to compile your weekly responses into your project with an introduction or summary of how you see the Ten Commandments in your life.

Project Format: Choose the format (academic or artistic) to complete your project.

An academic project: something like what you would do for a class project or science fair. For example:

- A written paper (roughly 1,000 words)
- A poster presentation or trifold display
- A PowerPoint, or Prezi
- Other multimedia presentation of 3 - 7 minutes in length
- An informational speech of 3 - 7 minutes in length

An artistic project: something that uses your artistic abilities to explore one of the Ten Commandments. For example:

- A painting, drawing, or sketch
- A sculpture
- A song, either sung or played on an instrument
- A dramatic speaking piece
- Original poetry

Your project must be done by you alone, without a partner or group, unless you can present a convincing reason why your project requires more than one person.

Projects will be turned in electronically. More information on options for submitting projects will be shared in the weekly Confirmation Connection as the due date gets closer. This project will have two due date options: option 1, is **Friday, December 18, 2020**, if you'd like to turn it in before Christmas, option 2, is **Monday, January 4, 2021**, if you'd like the time of winter break to complete your project.
